#### A Reflection from the Rev. Katie Beth Miksa

This time of year always seems a bit dreary. There are many overcast days, filled with cold and little light. When I was younger, my family would pass the days with a daily Advent calendar. Ours was not the kind with chocolate or little gifts. Ours was a cloth one with a cloth toy soldier that moved each day toward Christmas. In my adult life, I have missed out on purchasing one of these coffee or tea calendars I keep hearing about. I never seem to remember to order them in time, yet I haven't missed out on the joy. Sitting in my living room is an Advent wreath made of hewn walnut and filled with beeswax candles. Each week, I will turn out the lights, say the seasonal prayers and blessings, then light the appropriate number of candles.



There's something about the warmth of the fire and the light from the candle that just sparks joy. The room is the same, yet it appears different in the flickering light. The smell of the hot beeswax wafts in the air. It reminds me of leather oil I used to clean saddles when I was younger. And each week there is more light, and more smells, and more memories. With each week, my expectation of the coming of Christmas grows. Christmas is, after all, a celebration of the moment the light of Christ becomes incarnate — entering into the world such that the darkness could not overcome it.

So if you are like me and find yourself growing bothered by all these gray days, I invite you to find your own Advent candles to light. May lighting them help you see the ordinary just a little bit differently. May you find joy in the memories they evoke. And may you be reminded of the hope we have in the coming of Christ. Amen.

# The Christmas Pageant is Coming!



# **Shepherd's Closet Rummage**






## **Bible Study**

▼ Little Free Library – Filling the church neighborhood with books to read. Your donations are always welcome or help yourself to a book if you spot a good one – they are there for anyone and everyone.



- ▶ Last Sunday Supper The next meal will be Sunday, December 29. Since Come help set-up and cook beginning at 1 PM or come help serve and clean-up at 5:15 PM. We begin serving at 5:30 and continue until 6/6:15 or earlier if we run out of food. We are usually out of the building by 7 or 7:15.
- ▼ Food Pantry If you would like to help handing out the bags, the current need is someone on Tuesday morning. We also need substitute helpers when someone is out of town or ill. Contact Linda if you can serve a few hours weekly or just as needed.






Katie Beth reveals her pink stole during her first sermon at Good Shepherd
